# BRIDGE Across Asia Conference 2022 -Face myself, Know others, Meet the new world-

#### 1. Programme Outline

High school students from diverse backgrounds from five countries in the Asia-Pacific region will engage in collaborative learning. Specifically, by using various methods such as interactive workshops and Model UNESCO, ACCU aims to deepen participnats' understanding of global issues and develop their problem-solving skills, tolerance for diversity, and motivation for the future, all of which are necessary to live in today's society.

#### 2. Background

With the recent pandemic, national conflicts, and various other problems, society has become unstable, and we live in uncertain times with widespread intolerance. In this situation, the importance of empowering high school students, the future leaders of our society, is increasing. This programme aims to increase the sensitivity of this generation to diversity and their motivation for the future and nurture their ability to think through questions that have no correct answer. To this end, ACCU will conduct an international collaborative learning programme for high school students from the Asia-Pacific region, who have diverse backgrounds, to deepen their understanding of "self, others, and society" through collaborative learning.

#### 3. Objectives

The programme aims to develop the following four competencies and qualities in the participants.

- (1) Think deeply and logically
- (2) Tolerance
- (3) Motivation
- (4) Understanding of global issues and problem-solving skills: To increase participants' interest in and understanding of global issues and develop the skills necessary to solve them (ability to formulate questions, express oneself, and collaborate with others).

This programme will deepen dialogue among participants with diverse backgrounds by their thinking through questions with no correct answer. This will lead to their deeper understanding and empathy for others and foster tolerance. Without jumping to easy conclusions, the awareness and learning gained through thinking deeply will motivate

participants to continue thinking and acting after the programme period, even if they do not come to a clear answer.

#### 4. Participants

a. The number of participants: 40 in total

Five high school students each from Mongolia, Korea, Thailand and India, recommended by Mongolian National Commission for UNESCO, Korean National Commission for UNESCO, Thai National Commission for UNESCO, Center for Environmental Education, India, will participate online and pair up with 20 high school students from Japan.
